John Starnes, our Chairman, who handles our insurance scheme, tells me that he still gets requests from Clubs for Cups and Trophies insurance but, up to now he has been unable to find any reputable

company prepared to handle this type of business.

Clubs belonging to the R.H.S are reminded that, for a premium of £58, R.H.S can offer this cover. There is a limit of £5,000 for cups and trophies, and an excess of £50 per claim. The premium includes cover for audio-visual and show staging equipment. Those interested please contact R.H.S direct.Clubs not members of R.H.S must of course first join to obtain this facility.

Affiliation of Societies to the R.H.S.

By now most societies already affiliated to the R.H.S will have received the details of affiliation to R.H.S for 1995. We hope you will be pleased with the mew membership benefits and subscription package which has taken account of the Affiliated Society research for which you filled in a form earlier this year. This package is as follows; NEW.Subscription for 1995.

As from 1st November 1994, the subscription for Affiliated Societies will be £12- a reduction of nearly 50% This gives your society all the benefits previously available, except individual members visits

to R.H.S gardens.

NEW- the Garden Entry Card.

Your society can purchase up to three Garden Entry Cards at £8 each as an optional extra to your subscription. This card allows one member and a guest at any one time to visit Wisley, Rosemore or Hyde Hall for 30% less than the general public and only applies to the above gardens.

Group Visits

One free group visit for up to 55 members may be arranged in advance with the Administration to one of the R.H.S. gardens at Wisley and Rosemore or Hyde Hall.Details of the proposed date and time of the visit must be given at least two weeks in advance, and as there is a limit to the number of group visits that can be arranged on Sundays and during peak summer months a number of alternative dates should be given. If you want to organise a second visit to these gardens the special admission prices are printed below. Chelsea tickets.

Affiliated societies can purchase two tickets for the 1995 Chelsea Flower Show at reduced prices for either the Thursday(£12) or Friday (£10)

NEW- Group admission to flower shows.

There will be special Affiliated group rates for 10 or more members to R.H.S flower shows other than Chelsea Flower Show. Westminster Flower Shows £4 on first day and £2 on second day, Harrogate Spring Show £7.50 -£5, Malvern Spring Gardening Show £4.50, Hampton Court Palace Show £11, BBC Gardeners' World Live £8.50. Affiliated society group rates for Harrogate Great Autumn are unconfirmed at time of going to press but Affiliated society groups will be offered a £1 discount on full-day tickets.

Other benefits that remain unchanged are as follows;

* A copy of "The Garden" sent free every month(worth £30)and the opportunity to purchase as an optional extra up to a further three copies at the special rate of £12 per volume(12 monthly issues)

* A free copy of the Affiliated societies Newsletter sent each Sprin and Autumn.

* A 25% discount on certain R.H.S publications.

* A Banksian Medal (or a Grenfell medal for flower arrangement societies) for award annually at onof your society's flower shows (upon application)

* Available for purchase Affiliated Societies medals, medal cards, show stationery and transparencies or blocks of Affiliated Societies

* Free advice on any matter relating to the welfare of your society and gardening problems or plant identification.
